YWCA Metropolitan Phoenix's *Racial Equity, Action and Learning – Theory of Change* (REAL-TOC) leads participants through the process of crafting a customized Race Equity Theory of Change taking into consideration - organizational goals, necessary conditions, barriers, opportunities and internal capacity.

Anticipated Learning Outcomes

<u>Content-based:</u> Participants will deepen their capacity to:

- Unpack and understand the root causes and dynamics of systemic and structural racism
- Examine internal and external conditions that will influence the success of action strategies (either positively or negatively)
- Understand action strategies most likely to dismantle structural racism and promote racial equity
- Create (AND RE-CREATE) comprehensive Racial Equity Theory of Change processes to inform the organization's progress toward goals.
- Collaborate with other community leaders committed to improving racial equity in their community.

Process-based: based on facilitation styles, participants will be engaged to feel:

- Connected to other participants; valued, respected, part of the learning community
- Challenged enough to consider and explore new and/or different perspectives
- Willing to engage authentically across differences
- Energized to explore and implement strategies for improved racial equity within their organization
